Local Amenities

Teme Triangle

is a monthly magazine, distributed free to all households. It gives details of most activities in the village.

Village Hall

Is an ancient church in Clifton Parish. The [St Kenelm's Church](#) looks to uphold traditional values whilst appreciating that services need to change to accommodate new styles of worship.

The Hunt also organises the annual Clifton Point-to-Point races at Upper Sapey.
